Welcome Mike and Elaine Franklin to Grace Lutheran Church


On August 1, 2020, Grace Lutheran Church welcomed our newest

By working very closely with the Oregon Synod and Bishop Laurie, the Rev. Dorthy Nielsen has been selected to become our interim pastor. Pastor Dorthy comes to us from Silverton, Oregon where she resides with her husband John Dallum and dog Millie. Pastor Dorthy has an extensive background in being an interim pastor and also several years as a pastor in the ELCA. She also served as a youth director at two different churches.

Born in Esbjerg, Denmark, Pastor Dorthy graduated from Concordia in Moorhead, MN with a BA in Religion and also from Pacific Lutheran Theological Seminary, Berkeley, CA with Master in Divinity.


Adult Bible Study – September 2020






Luther House Campus Ministry




Saving Little-Fish by Richard M. Cary

Accurately set in the Pacific Northwest in 1806, near a Chinook village close to the mouth of the Columbia River, this book lets us experience the times and traditions of Native Americans and early American traders. This series of Richard Cary's books are geared toward readers ages 8 to 12 but this old lady learned a lot and thoroughly enjoyed them!! We met the author at one of our regional church library conferences – he was also one of the devotion leaders. He is passionate about teaching accurate history and letting his readers understand the importance of making good decisions when faced with hard choices.

Born to a white trader and an Indian mother (both former slaves in a nearby native village), ten year-old Miriam's life is formed by both cultures. From the first moment she sees a sickly slave baby, she longs to find a way to set her free. When she and her twin brother Moses find a gold coin on a forest trail, her whole life moves toward that goal. But how can a pair of ten year-olds make that happen?


I think this would make great end of summer/early fall reading for young and old. And take a look at some of these other books you could get from the Grace Library!!

This one-hour online program will highlight stories of camp, offer a virtual tour of our new dining hall, provide updates on our



projects, and more. Our goal is to reach even more friends, alumni, and supporters of camp through this digital format.

Grace Center News

I always learn something new about Grace Center, even when it is not open. For example there is the new word "telehealth", a reference to some of the new alternative services Grace Center will provide while the Oregon Department of Human Services will not allow adult day centers to fully re-open. Our excellent center staff has been using their skills to develop examples of telehealth such as one-on-one or group video chats. As of September 1st they will deliver activity kits at people's homes while maintaining social distancing. These kits will provide all the supplies and instructions necessary to do one activity per week. They will include games, crafts such as making home-made anti-stress-balls, and other things like beading activities. Participants can do these activities at home on their own or they can follow along on a live instruction video with other participants through a group video conference. There is grant funding so that Grace Center will be able to assist people who do not have the technology to do the telehealth services.
