The Cup of Our Life: A Guide for Spiritual Growth by Joyce Rupp





So, what if you were to change direction on some thing in your life. What would that look like? How about adding in some quiet time with God? Some people enjoy devotions with God in the morning, while others prefer in the afternoon or evening. Over 25 years ago my quiet time was commuting to Berkeley from the Peninsula—37 miles. With the radio off, the tape deck off, I could drive and listen for God. That time kept me grounded, as I was also working in San Francisco. My car became my place of prayer and listening. I am getting back to that quiet time with God during my twice a week commute from Silverton to Corvallis.

What I have discovered over and over is this God who has come close enough to listen to all the beloved children. With practice it gets easier to listen for God's voice to speak. What do you hear God saying to you? Maybe God speaks to you through a song. Or a poem. Or a bird's happy chirping. God uses all kinds of means to speak to us, if we guiet our lives a bit to listen, to connect.

Some people have chosen to sign off from social media, as a fast, for the season of Lent. In the past a few have decided to completely stop their use of social media once Easter comes. Several very artistic people I know have created special artwork during Lent, even on social media, posting only their work, which inspires the rest of us.

If we were to take some time to chat over coffee, tea, or soda, there could be a whole host of ideas for Lenten disciplines. Learning something new, or reconnecting with something that has been meaningful and helpful can help in developing one's spiritual life in Christ Jesus.

The spiritual retreat using The Cup of Our Life, by Joyce Rupp, is one of those special resources for me. Each day has new moments with God where I can reconnect with my baptismal identity as one of God's beloved children.

Lent is another of those "new beginnings" for us. Like September return to the usual schedule, or January 1 begins the new year, Lent gives us a time of new beginning, or beginning again. Lent is a gift of reconnecting with God, of grounding our lives so that we can listen and learn and know that we are profoundly loved.

I invite you into the Lenten season to rediscover your life in Christ, or maybe even discover it for the first time. Our God is the One who makes sacred promises to us and keeps them.



Growing Young Means Growing Together!



In retrospect, the researchers say they might have changed the name: Growing Young really means Growing Together. "Everyone rises when younger generations are included."

While it is true that most churches' average age is growing older and older, Fuller Youth Institute (FYI) studied 250 congregations who are doing well engaging young people in ministry. These strategic churches are discovering that the generations really can grow together. Wouldn't this be a wonderful future for Grace?

Grace's Christian Education Committee finds this research so promising that we've joined a cohort of teams from congregations around the world who are spending a year learning how to put Growing Young into practice.

The researchers tell us that the pivot point comes when congregations "prioritize young people (and families) everywhere. Instead of giving lip service to how much young people matter, look for creative ways to tangibly support, resource, and involve them in all facets of your congregation."

It might not need to be said, but this means something different than getting young people to do things the way we've always done them. It also means something different than letting go of the past and looking to young people to have all the answers. What it does mean is honoring the space between us, and Jesus in the midst of it. It means engaging our differences and similarities – hearing one another's voices, really listening for God calling...

Here's a challenge: This month have a conversation with someone from a different generation. Really listen. Share your dreams, your hopes for the world. Don't evaluate. Don't correct. Just listen. Pay attention. Who knows where God is calling us?


February meeting of the Grace Globaliers

Call in the New Testament

During this quarter we will examine God's call in stories found in the New Testament. Of course, the greatest call came to Jesus. The other calls in the new Testament led to the extension of Christian ministry into the known world.

The call stories of the Old Testament are probably better known than those in the Christian scriptures, the New Testament. We can name Moses' call in the burning bush story. We remember that Isaiah's call in the temple resulted in his saying, "Here I am, Lord, send me." We may recall from Sunday school days the call of the young Samuel in Eli's house in the middle of the night. And the lineup of Jesse's sons that ended up with David being anointed as the future king has shaped our expectations of what God's call looks like.

While it's true that the Old Testament narratives of call have a bit of drama, they are not the only way God calls people. Jesus taught his disciples that everyone brings something to the table when it comes to bringing God's realm to everyday life. And God doesn't call only those who are qualified. Quite the opposite – often God empowers the very people we would not expect.

From foreign wise men to rich women to gentle old men, God provides what is needed through ordinary people like you and me. We have our own unique calls to bring the good news of God's love to our friends, families, neighbors, and coworkers.

The goals of this study include developing a broader and deeper understanding of God's call and an appreciation for the ways people respond positively to that call. We will gain familiarity with several books of the New Testament and the call stories found there.

Sunday, February 14, 2021 Transfiguration of Our Lord

Introduction

The Sundays after Epiphany began with Jesus' baptism and end with three disciples' vision of his transfiguration. In Mark's story of Jesus' baptism, apparently only Jesus sees the Spirit descending and hears the words from heaven. But now Jesus' three closest friends hear the same words naming him God's Beloved. As believers, Paul writes, we are enabled to see the God-light in Jesus' face, because the same God who created light in the first place has shone in our hearts to give us that vision. The light of God's glory in Jesus has enlightened us through baptism and shines in us also for others to see.

Sunday, February 21, 2021 First Sunday in Lent

Introduction

On Ash Wednesday the church began its journey toward baptismal immersion in the death and resurrection of Christ. This year, the Sundays in Lent lead us to focus on five covenants God makes in the Hebrew Scriptures and to use them as lenses through which to view baptism. First Peter connects the way God saved Noah's family in the flood with the way God saves us through the water of baptism. The baptismal covenant is made with us individually, but the new life we are given in baptism is for the sake of the whole world.

Introduction

The second covenant in this year's Lenten readings is the one made with Abraham and Sarah: God's promise to make them the ancestors of many, with whom God will remain in everlasting covenant. Paul says this promise comes to all who share Abraham's faith in the God who brings life into being where there was no life. We receive this baptismal promise of resurrection life in faith. Sarah and Abraham receive new names as a sign of the covenant, and we too get new identities in baptism, as we put on Christ.
