I appeal to you therefore, brothers and sisters, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God, which is your spiritual worship.

Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your minds, so that you may discern what is the will of God—what is good and acceptable and perfect.

Romans 12:1-2

Dear People of Grace,

May your summer be a time of hope and joy, in faith and peace through Jesus Christ. He alone is our light and life.

This passage from Romans is good guidance for our lives, especially during this time of transition at Grace. This is about the whole of our lives—body, mind, and soul—being shaped by worship of God and transformed by the renewing of our minds, in order to discern God's will for Grace faith community.

What does it mean to be a living sacrifice? What does it mean to be transformed by the renewing of our minds? How do we discern God's will?

These are hard things. Necessary things. Good things. This has to do with growing in faith and knowledge, seeking God's will, which isn't always easily spotted. Knowing God's will takes deep discernment.

Discernment has to do with deep study, perception, analyzing, and searching for understanding and decision making. You, dear Grace, are in discernment. What is God's will for you for the coming years, for calling a new pastor, for figuring out God's mission and orientation for this wonderful faith community.

Discernment takes time, trust, and also transformation. In the letter to the Christians in Rome, St Paul is letting them know that learning, maturing in faith, the renewing of your minds, is what brings on the transformation needed to discern God's will.

The Council and the Transition Team are doing some of the discernment needed. But you also are needed in the discernment of God's will for Grace. Are you ready? You certainly have been helpful so far. More opportunities to come.

Grace has discerned for many years that the adjoining properties could be a dynamic ministry opportunity to dream and develop. Now, Grace and Luther House leaders are discerning how to strengthen both ministries. What will be discerned in these possibilities? God knows! And I can tell you, the leaders involved are going deep to figure things out. God is leading.

However, Grace cannot move forward into a new horizon of opportunities for ministry without the entire congregation being "transformed by the renewing of your minds" in order to discern God's will for Grace's ministry at Kings and Harrison, and into the community.

So how will you be transformed by the renewing of your minds? Are you involved in a Bible study group? Or a book discussion group? Would you like to have coffee with me or someone on Council or the Transition Team to talk deeply about your hopes and dreams?

Here are two opportunities for you...

- 1. Wednesdays, beginning August 11th Wednesday Coffee Collective from 1-2:30 pm I will host a coffee time at Grace in the Courtyard. Bring your own coffee, or there will be fresh coffee and tea at the ready. There will be a conversation prompt, if needed. All are welcome.
- 2. **Bible study interest meeting on Sunday, August 29**th after worship. This will be a 30 minute meeting in the Fireside Room/Courtyard to explore Bible study topics, themes, sources, times and dates, to begin in September.

Let us be transformed for these days, by renewing our minds together. So that we can be open to God's will. Let's step into God's way.

Grace Lutheran Church Disaster Resource Center Plan

Updated: July 13, 2021

In the event of a natural or unexpected disaster in our community, Grace Lutheran Church will work under the direction of Benton County Emergency Management and set up a Disaster Resource Center at the property located at 435 NW 21st Street in Corvallis, Oregon. This Plan will be determined by need, condition and safety of the church building, access to water and electricity on site, and availability of consistent volunteers.

Disaster Resource Center Plan:

To be open 3 days a week for 4-6 hours for the duration of the emergency.

- Overflow Parking for fully contained vehicles. This will be after Benton County Fairgrounds and Reser Stadium (OSU) are full.
- Walk-in resource pick up
 - Walk-ins will be in Ronnenkamp Hall
 - Resource materials will be provided by Benton County Emergency Management
- Access to Restrooms
- Access to area for Diaper Changing
- Short Term Cell Phone Charging Area
- Beverages available
- Donations of food and financial assistance will be forwarded to Stone Soup or other meal site to assist with their ministry.


