"Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? Therefore we have been buried with him by baptism into death, so that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, so we too might walk in newness of life."

Romans 6:3-4

To God's beloved at Grace Lutheran in Corvallis, who are called to be saints:

"Grace to you and peace from God our Parent and the Lord Jesus Christ." (Romans 1:7)

July is a month that holds special meaning for me. Two dates in July mark life-changing events for me: baptism and marriage. One brings me into a deeper relationship with God and God's beloveds; the other into a deeper relationship with my life partner, John.

In baptism we have died to sin and risen to new life in Christ Jesus. This, as you well know, does not mean we have become sinless. Wishful thinking! That baptismal death means Sin no longer has power or control over us. Yes, we still sin. However, that is not who we are now, because of baptism. Baptism in the name of the Triune God reminds us that we belong to God. The imagery of baptism is death and life; death to what we have been, and rising from the waters to new life, changed life, to Easter life.

St Paul says that we are changed. Now we can live our true identity. We can be our authentic selves. Then, when we sin, God says, "This isn't like you. Be who you are! Be your real self, my beloved child." And we hear those precious words of forgiveness.

When I married John at age 43, I experienced death and new life, as well. Life as a single person

was self-determined and self-focused, doing what I chose to do, and when. That had to change when we got married. We made a commitment to each other to life together. All other relationships had to change to some degree—except for my relationship with Christ, which deepened with our shared faith in Christ, which made us one. However, decision-making changed, certain habits changed, as we figured out what it means to be a couple. Finding out who I am as a wife and partner has been challenging for me at times. Yet I continue to learn how to be my authentic self in this precious relationship with John.

God's beloved at Grace, through baptism into Christ Jesus, we have been called into community with God and each other, and has also changed our relationship to the world. When we remember our baptism, re remember to whom we belong. We belong to God and to each other. No longer are our interests focused on ourselves, but on the common good. This belonging strengthens us and our living out our true identity as God's beloved.

This baptismal life in Christ that we share leads us to new places and insights, new relationships and new missions. So this transition time in Grace's life is about new life, about living into our authentic self as a community in these changing times. We can continue to live into our true identity as God's beloved because God's grace in Christ Jesus is the response to human sin. God's unmeted love is greater than sin. And that is what our baptismal life carries into the world to share—God's love.

During this transition time we need to explore God's invitation into new ministry models for the coming years. The Spirit of God has been stirring things for a while now. Can we imagine what this next new life at Grace could be? Remember your baptism! Remember to whom you belong! Be who you are, beloved!

From Grace Transition Team

Thank you for your participation in the survey questions on June 6th at Worship in the Park. We are reviewing your responses to help us understand who Grace has been and is now, as well as what God is calling Grace to do in the coming years. You also weighed in on the qualities you think we need in a pastor serving Grace. This has been helpful as well.

The Team has begun to put together the MSP, the Ministry Site Profile. This 12+ page document will be the first look candidate pastors will have of Grace, so it is incumbent upon us to be in conversation with you on things like Mission, Leadership, Connections, and what the Future could be. Without your input we cannot complete this necessary document.

When the MSP is completed and Council has approved it, the document will be submitted to Bishop Laurie Larsen Caesar. At that time the Council will begin to form the Call Committee. Their task is to know the MSP and the type of pastor Grace believes is needed for the coming years, and write interview questions. Bishop Laurie will bring RMPs (Rostered Leader Profile) for the Call Committee to consider for interview. Once they settle on a candidate pastor they will recommend that person to the Council, who will call a congregation meeting for vote. This is still a ways off. Please be patient.

In the meantime, the Transition Team, in order to address areas of Mission, Leadership and the Future, has decided to invite Grace Council and Luther House Board to meet and start a conversation on how we might be strengthening our ministries, and other possibilities for the future. The meeting will be taking place in early July, and is a beginning conversation between both ministries.

Thank you for your willingness to engage in this process. With Grace re-opening, we hope to do some more interactive and conversational in-person stuff. Be watching for those opportunities. Keep in mind that this is a new time, and also the time of Covid-19 challenges our concepts of what church is and will be. Though there may be some unknowns, we do know this: Christ is the head of the Church, and the Spirit of God is at work in this transition process.


