

Dear people of Grace,

Transitions are a lot of work. There is much to do to prepare for the next chapter of life, whether that is in your own life, in the life of a business, organization, or a church. Joy, grief, anxiety, hope, all get mixed around, sometimes complicating how to move forward. There rarely are clear pathways through transitions. It's messy at times. And that is ok.

Transitions include good-byes and hellos: good-byes to staff, loved ones, ways of doing what we have done, and honoring the grief we feel; and saying hellos that welcome new people and whatever they have to share in this wild thing of being called into community and ministry, and dreaming dreams together for the sake of the ministry of Jesus in and through Grace.

Some have likened transitions to wilderness time. Others see it as a journey to new horizons. What is important is listening, communicating, taking risks, collaborating, and whatever else is needed to work through transition time.

The transition at Grace is moving into a time of discernment with Luther House-Campus Ministries. There have been three communal gatherings, two via Zoom, walking together during this time. It began with the leadership of both ministries and now welcomes all who wish to be part of the discernment process.

On Sunday, September 19th during our third communal discernment engagement we talked about what it means to "set a shared table." We are looking at a shared **horizon** for possible pathways, rather than one vision of how we think leadership and mission should be structured.

This is all new territory, so we cannot think in terms of "how we used to do it." Clearly that doesn't work anymore in this time and context. So we are figuring out what new ways of leading will benefit both ministries, and whether that includes sharing staff in some creative and unique ways.

Yes, there might be some things that stay the same. However, the horizon before Grace and Luther House is ripe with new possibilities, and the Holy Spirit of God is leading the way forward. Your leaders are doing what they can to listen and learn and see in new ways. It is not easy, but it is exciting and hopeful.

The communal discernment process for Grace and Luther House has looked at the questions: Who are we (identity)? Who is our neighbor (context)? And what is God calling us to do/be (mission)? We have considered the pressure points on families, neighbors,

students, communities, and listened to what each values to see where our relationships intersect. We have listened across generations, and heard concerns for the Corvallis community, for students away from home, and other insights.

Now we are learning what our capacities are for ministry. Like a potluck, we are bringing to the table the resources we all have, not just the two ministries but importantly, the people of Grace and Luther House, students and those who give support.

As we lay down "the way we have done things" to take up the new ways God is already calling us into ministry, what is the leadership we will need to walk into a new, shared horizon? What will be your commitment to this process at Grace, at Luther House, in this time and context?

Remember when I said you are "weird?" Well, weird people respond well to weird times, and that is a fantastic thing. It is freeing. We can't do some things the way we used to do them. So, what will we become for the sake of the gospel of Jesus? Who will be our partners in this mission? What will you commit to in these transitions? Into what do you hear the Spirit of God calling Grace?

Let me just say this: Transition is the new "norm," for Grace, for you and me, for Corvallis, and the world. Let's accept this reality.

Pr Melissa Reed, our Bishop's Associate who has been guiding the communal discernment process, grounded us with the Luke 24 Walk to Emmaus story. Amid the grief, fear, confusion, the two walking home are accompanied by Jesus, though they don't recognize him. It is in the shared table when he breaks the bread that they see him.


The risen Christ meets us when we share table and meal with others. He breaks open the wild possibilities for new life to be fed and nourished. What do you bring to the table? What does Grace bring to the table of shared ministry with Luther House? Both ministries are in Corvallis, blocks from each other, in the same neighborhood. One gave birth the other, and are complimentary ministries. What is God up to now?

In October there will be two opportunities for you to give input to this discernment process. You are needed. If you are comfortable, we will meet in the sanctuary after worship to listen, learn and give voice to what can be.

Ever since I was a young teen, volunteering and doing charity walks was just part of life. Right before high school. I volunteered at the local nursing home painting the ladies nails in the dining room and before that I walked in my first walk for the Alzheimer's Association. As I became an adult, the Alzheimer's Association walk was just something we did as a family and we would look forward to doing it every year.

After moving to the Albany area over 9 years ago, the world of volunteering opened up, and I found joy in giving back to my community. My monthly calendar would fill up with volunteering events from dressing up. Over the last almost 2.5 years I have worked at as Mrs. Claus at Christmas Storybook Land to volunteering with the local Parent Club in my daughters school. From late spring to early fall I would find myself walking multiple 5K's to support different causes from the Alzheimer's Association to the Foundation Fighting Blindness and many in between. There is nothing like the energy that comes from the gathering of people all for a specific cause.

For much of my adult life, I lived paycheck to paycheck, barely being able to provide the essential items my daughter and family would need. The extra money we may have had would go towards treating my daughter to frozen yogurt for her birthday or getting pizza for a sleep over with her friends. I did not have the ability to donate my money to organizations, but I had the ability to volunteer my time and to spread awareness.

When the Covid-19 pandemic hit, my joy in giving back was taken from me. The need did not stop, in fact, it may have increased, but the fear of getting sick or even activities and events being canceled prevented me from doing the volunteer work I enjoyed. Starting in March 2020, my calendar emptied and as I searched for things to do, I saw "Canceled" or needs I could not help with.

In early 2021, I realized that I let the pandemic take the joy out of my life, and I was ready to get it back. Since March of 2021, I have participated in 6 – 5K virtual walks for 5 different charities including Feeding America and Laughing at My Nightmare for Muscular Dystrophy. In August I found myself walking 50 miles in 21 days and fundraising for the American Cancer Society and now I find myself taking on the Fall Frenzy Challenge and walking at least 100K (62 miles) between September 7 and November 15 which will help Feeding America provide meals for those in need.

Grace Lutheran Church in Corvallis is a very giving church. Grace members give to their community in many ways. Although some of these gifts may be financial, Grace members are not afraid to give their time and efforts to our community. Grace members volunteer at the local food bank and Men's Cold Weather Shelter along with the yearly God's Work Our Hands project. Grace members are not afraid to get their hands dirty and assist community members in tasks they can't do.

Grace, I have seen what Grace is. Grace is a congregation who gives back, because they can. Grace is a community of people who have been called to do these activities. Grace members and Grace's activities are what draws me to Grace because Grace knows our community needs more then just financial gifts. Grace's drive to be a presence in our community is why I am choosing to become a member of Grace Lutheran Church in Corvallis, Oregon. I am excited to spread my gifts and to feel joy with others.



Check out *Growing Young* in the Grace Library By Wendy Geist

"We are adopted into one body. That means smelly teenagers and jaded emerging adults are connected tendon-to-bone with great-grandparents of the faith as they work out community together." This is an interesting and colorful quote I found in the book *Growing Young*. These words from Chapter 5, titled "Fuel a Warm Community," are just a snippet of the multitude of examples and information contained in the book, which is based on four years of research by the Fuller Youth Institute, of Fuller Theological Seminary in Pasadena. CA.

The authors Kara Powell, Jake Mulder, and Brad Griffin, present this gathered pool of knowledge on how to better involve and retain young people, ages 15 to 29, in your congregation. They explain to the reader that youth are searching for identity, belonging and purpose; they want to figure out "Who Am I?", "Where do I fit?" and "What difference do I make?" One strategy is to entrust young people with church leadership roles, and in return "they will trust you with their hearts, their energy, their creativity, and even their friends." The book leads the reader through six essential strategies and includes reflection questions to help lead your congregation on the path to Growing Young. Grace Lutheran Church Library has two copies available for checkout.


Bible Study-Faith Conversations on Wednesdays starting up!
