Dear People of God at Grace,

Even before New Year's Eve there was growing displays of red hearts, cards, and candy! The next thing...Valentine's Day on Feb 14<sup>th</sup>. Then comes St Patrick's Day in March, Easter in April, Mother's Day in May...and on and on it goes...

Time is rolling on, not stopping for anyone. And this pandemic keeps on rolling as well. With the latest variant Grace has returned to worshipping through online means, as have numerous other congregations, for the sake of care for one another. This is certainly disappointing.

Yet there are signs of hope and promise all around us. Studies are showing that for the vaccinated the threat is lower, even though there has been a increase in cases. Grace's ability to pivot back to online has been amazing. We are still able to gather through Zoom for Holy Communion and meetings. We will survive, things are getting better, and ministry is still happening.

Looking back, over the past two years as well as through history, what we hear and see and hold on to is God's promise to never abandon us.

In Genesis 28, Jacob has escaped the anger of his brother Esau. Jacob had tricked their father, Isaac, and stole Esau's first born blessing. After finding a safe place to sleep while on the run, Jacob has a dream. There was a ladder extended from earth to heaven, with angels (God's messengers) ascending and descending. In the dream, God comes to stand beside Jacob, telling him that he will be blessed with many children, and how the earth will be blessed through him. Then God says "Know that I am with you and will keep you wherever you go, and will bring you back to this land; for I will not leave you until I have done what I have promised you." (v15)

This beautiful story is ours as well. God has promised that even though time will pass, and things happen both good and bad, that God will be with us

"until I have done what I have promised you." Time cannot change God's presence with us.

Jesus repeats this when he commissions his disciples before he ascends to heaven, "And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age." (Matthew 28:20)

There are so many times in our scriptures that we hear God promise to be with us: Psalm 23; Romans 8; Revelation 21; and many other verses. We are not abandoned. God is with us. Let us cling to this hope and promise.

And so we endure, knowing that no matter what comes, we are not alone.

Time marches on. It is not the enemy, though it may feel that way at times. How do we mark time? Certainly through the holidays of our culture and the greeting card companies! LOL!

Valentine's Day, St Patty's Day, birthdays, anniversaries, graduations, are ways we mark time. We also use rituals to help mark time like lighting candles after school or work, mealtime prayers, getting up and exercising before coffee, gathering for worship, going to 12-step meetings, and the like.

When rituals are part of the community, it is a way to not only mark time but recognize God with us. At no time are we left on our own. That is such a comfort to me. I hope it is for you as well.

So as time rolls on and we are still in this long season of pandemic, let us mark time together in worship of the God who is with us always. And let us help each other remember that God is with us.

## **Grace Library Loves Ron Larson!**

Grace Church Library has a Library Champion...Ron Larson, Grace Property Manager, read 62 books from October 2020 thru December 31, 2021. All because the Corvallis Public Library closed due to COVID-19. Out of curiosity I talked with Ron for an hour and a half. This is just a

curiosity I talked with Ron for an hour and a half. This is just a bit from the engaging conversation we had.

For 20 years Ron volunteered for SCORE, a group that mentored small business people. In 2019, a transition occurred, the local chapter was too small and was going to be absorbed by the Portland Chapter. Not interested in going to Portland, Ron resigned, retired, and found himself with extra time. With this time, he devoted himself to reading books from

the Corvallis Public Library. Ron read nearly 2 dozen books on WWI, WWII, the Korean and Vietnam Wars. Authors which appealed to Ron, were those writing as retired military officers. Their first-hand experiences were how *they* viewed the Political scene, not the Washington narrative. That is, things were going badly. These Veterans had what Ron termed "a reckoning." That is "was it [the War] necessary?" For many of these authors, they were on a "search for forgiveness." As a Veteran in the Cold War during 1956-1960, Ron flew in surveillance planes in the North Pacific Ocean "keeping an eye on the Russians." He says this is effective diplomacy, rather than outright aggression. With the collection of Intelligence the goal is, "can we be smarter and ward off a stupid move?"


Ron speaks also of cherishing his experiences starting Bible Study on Sundays with Pastor Martha, and gathering ideas with Donna King; and with Frank and Sue Davis who have led it for some time now. The discussions with attendees brought people close because they often shared their personal life journeys while covering Old Testament family conflicts. This brought Moses and Aaron to mind for Ron.

While reading the 62 Grace Library books, Ron talked about three areas he covered: Theology, Christianity and Autobiography/Biography. Ron said he "gained an understanding of true Bible History, of the larger wider perspective of strife and suffering." In reading on Christianity, he searched out what the Lutherans believe, and found differences in other religions that he hadn't thought about and found "a deeper understanding of my faith." His topic of greatest enjoyment is Autobiography/Biography.



When I asked Ron what were his favorite books, he cited three autobiographies. The first was *Goodbye is Not Forever* by Amy George, who was born in the Ukraine in 1936 whose father was sent to Siberia, and were not reunited until 40 years later in America. The second book is *The Burning Fence* by Craig Leslie who grew up with no father role model and how he becomes a better father to his kids as a Christian. The third favorite of Ron's is *Sticks, Stones and Songs* by Eleanor Cory about a poor family of 12 growing up making bad decisions who then reunited all as adults in the 70's. Several siblings had gone on different missions throughout the world. To Ron Grace Church has a tremendous asset with its Library to spark interest, appreciate your upbringing, and to always be called upon to help others and be amateur ambassadors of the world.

Ron says, he is thankful he has good health; that wealth for him is learning all about his faith, to do what we're called upon to do and to help our fellow man and to believe in Christ.






