Dear People of God at Grace,

Recently I came across a book I read about five years ago, called The Mission Table: Renewing Congregation and Community by Stephen P Bouman (an ELCA pastor). I am reading it again and wondering if anyone else is interested in reading it with me. Let me know.

In chapter 4, "The Congregation: A Table for Mission" Pr Bouman explores the Ten Biblical Marks of a Missional Congregation.

A congregation in mission...

- 1. ...is always listening.
- 2. ...mentors and trains its leaders
- 3. ...nurtures communal leadership
- 4. ...faces paralysis with courage
- 5. ...re-roots in its community
- 6. ...risks new things
- 7. ...makes all decisions based on its mission
- 8. ...is clear about money and relationships
- 9. ...is propelled by the resurrection of Jesus
- 10....is shaped by Word and sacraments

This is quite a list. In the book Pr Bouman highlights many related Bible readings and interprets each mark. Here are some quotes and notes from the book.

<u>Listening:</u> "The most effective mission strategies I have encountered...have been ... congregations really caring and creating space and hospitality for the stories of their members and neighbors to be told...to be in mission is to listen." That means going into the neighborhood to listen to people, to hear what is going on in their lives.

Train leaders: "A missional congregation invests in leaders and has a plan for leadership development...A time of mission strategy and discernment can be an opportunity to develop the gifts and passions of people." Who is inviting the next generation of church and community to lead? Are we setting tables for collaboration?

<u>Nurturing communal leadership:</u> "I believe that mission today will be led by teams of leaders with a deep reservoir of gifts and talents that build up the leadership of the body of Christ." Leaders are clergy and lay people, young, old, sharing, encouraging, bold.

Face paralysis with courage: "The root meaning for the Old Norse word angr is grief. It is mourning the distance between what was and what has become...between what is and what ought to be." Grief is facing what has been lost and turning toward Jesus who transforms our grief for healing and action.

Re-roots in its community: "The door of a congregation must always to be open to the community, because, remember, Jesus allowed himself to be interrupted...Here all are welcome. All are loved. All come for resurrection." Being re-rooted in the community gives life to all.

Risks new things: "...God is already active in the world, and the church's mission is to join what God is already doing...Life in Christ asks us to step out continually into wider worlds, deeper spiritual insights, passionate engagement with the calling we have from God." We have nothing to lose, God's promise is already ours. Let's go out.

Decisions based on its mission: "We must ask of every budget line item, every choice we make... how will this help us join God...and build tables of relationships...for the life of the world? ... When mission sets the table, other priorities fall into place or fall away." Yes!

Money and relationships: "...the way in which we share our wealth captures how we see our relationships. It's a new kind of economics ... interdependent, equal, and reciprocating...a church in mission participates in the economy of its context." Our response to Gods grace and loving our neighbors.

<u>Propelled by the resurrection of Jesus:</u> "Reclaiming mission is to be again stunned by the resurrection of Jesus from the dead, to reclaim our utter dependence on the risen Lord." To live our baptism identity in the risen Christ.

Shaped by Word and sacraments: "The late Aidan Kavanaugh...said that the integrity of evangelism (sharing the good news of God's grace) is directly related to the integrity of the liturgy...and the heartbeat of [the Church] is Word and sacraments." Worshipping together shapes and prepares us for mission.

This fall we will host a Mission Table to explore our mission as God's people on the corner of Kings and Harrison! Come, listen and participate!

New Books from the Grace Church Library By Jody Parker

This summer I purchased six newly published books for the Grace Church Library at the PNACL Conference "Reuniting Through Reading" which I attended in June. All six authors were present at the Pacific Northwest Association of Church Libraries Annual Conference, so each book is signed by the author.

Two slip-time novels I purchased from the superbly skilled writer of this genre, Melanie Dobson, were *Winter Rose*, her very latest, and *Memories of Glass*, from 2019. *Winter Rose* is about Nazi Germany and the rescue of Jewish Children; *Memories of Glass* is about the Nazi German occupation of Holland. *The Bible's Plot Connecting the Bible's Story to Your Story* by minister Ken Ostot, delves excellently into ten significant stories of Bible persons. This is a meaningful and insightful, scholarly endeavor that you might enjoy, written by an experienced Bible Study leader.

Sheltering in Grace, Hopeful Insights in Uncertain Times by Chaplain Greg Asimakoupoulos is a collection of essays which he delivered as short morning radio addresses to Covenant Living Shores. This is a retirement home which was under lock down due to Covid-19 and the essays are thoughtful pieces designed to comfort and inspire.

Finally, two books I purchased are from Lutheran Pastor David Ellingson. They are in a series of books titled *Paddle Pilgrim*. The first subtitled, *An Adventure of Learning and Spirit, Kayaking the Mississippi River*, is 122 pages that chronicle his 2013 solo trip down the Mississippi River. This adventure took him two and a half months. The second *Paddle Pilgrim* book I purchased from him is subtitled, *Kayaking the Erie Canal & the Hudson River to the Statue of Liberty*, which took him about 3 weeks in 2019, but quite dangerous at a few points. The first book is rather a listing of his adventure interspersed with inspirational quotes from saints and Christian authors. In the Hudson River adventure his writing is more reflective. These two books inspired me to go on a mini pilgrimage of my own, but because I can't wander far from home alone and certainly not on the water, my adventure was a 12 mile walk at 5am to 8am, and well worth every step of the way.

Wisdom Seekers New book Starts September Wisdom Seekers will return in September

The Wisdom Seekers Book Group will start a new book on Thursday, September 8th - The Rapture Exposed: The Message of Hope in the Book of Revelation by Barbara R. Rossing, an ordained ELCA minister who teaches New Testament at the Lutheran School of Theology at Chicago. Written in 2004 in response to the "Left Behind" book series, Rossing says, "God is coming to heal the world, not to kill millions of people... God loves the world, and God will never leave the world behind." Bill Moyers writes, "She unfolds and affirms an alternative interpretation of one of the Bible's most complex books and points to a reading of its powerful metaphors that will stir the heart and honor the mind."

The book group meets every Thursday at noon via Zoom and welcomes new participants! The group enjoys lively discussions, reading a few chapters each week. If you would like to be added to the Zoom invitation, please contact Mark Klopsch at klopschm@comcast.net




