Dear People of God at Grace,

Now we begin the Church's liturgical calendar year...with Advent. This word speaks of the arrival of something or someone of importance, which has lasting impact.

The Church's liturgical calendar is a bit offset from our common calendar year and is meant to help us make sacred space for the high holy days we celebrate. So, Advent anticipates, waits for, prepares for the coming of the Christ, reaching back in our history to the ancestors of our faith, to the birth of Jesus, and to Christ's coming again.

In the Cambridge Dictionary, waiting is allowing time to go by, sometimes while staying in place, until whatever you are expecting happens or until you can do something. Wait time in line for a ride at the amusement park is filled with excitement and anticipation of the fun to be had. A pregnant mother waits and prepares for the arrival of her child. There is a different excitement that fills the time of waiting.

While on vacation in November, my car's battery died and the car completely stalled in the left lane during commute time. With emergency blinkers on, I tried everything to get my car into neutral to get pushed to the side, to no avail. Ack! The troubles of technology on cars. By the time a tow truck arrived over 30 minutes of being stuck and worry about getting rear ended by other cars had worked on me. I am thankful for my sister, also in the car, who got the help, the police officer whose lights were a better signal to my stall, and the towing mechanic who gave the battery a jump start. That was difficult waiting.

Our Advent waiting gives us an opportunity to open up waiting space, sacred space for God to come to us. In the gift buying and wrapping, in cookie making, in writing Christmas messages to loved ones, and preparations for gathering, Advent comes to give us space and time to breathe and to quiet our souls, opening

up to the hope we have in the Holy One who comes to be with us.

Like a caterpillar, Advent cocoons us for the emerging of God's liberating grace which reaches out to us all the time. That sacred Advent space and time transforms us again and again. It is counter-cultural, even. We push back on the consumerism of this time of year and wait and watch for the ways God comes to us each day.

So set up your Advent wreath and mark the days. Put up your tree and decorations with a song of thanksgiving for this time. Display your creche to remember the birth of Christ. Pray and watch and wait with eager longing. The Lord God comes in surprising ways.



#### **Update on 2022 Financial Stewardship**

Both the congregation council and stewardship committee, monthly, look at our financial stewardship to verify receipts and expenditures are in line. In general, this has been a very good year with receipts often running above expenditures and even over budget some months.

Furthermore, things are beginning to take off at Grace as we venture out after the pandemic. One of my methods of measuring a congregation's vitality is the number of children going forward for the children's sermon on Sunday mornings. For months stretching through more than a year, the number of children going forward has been around three. Lately, ten has been closer to an average number! Use of our marvelous facilities are being increased both by ourselves and outside groups. We are truly in the spring of our recovery!

That is the good news! The "however" includes offering and other receipts for the months of September and October (see graph at the end of this paragraph). These last two full month reports show that our expenditures while still below budget, have exceeded our income. Of the \$8,400 deficit in income compared to expenditures that we have accrued in 2022, \$13,049 has been in the last two months. Confusing? That says prior to the last two months we were receiving income for the year at a rate of \$4,649 above expenditures.

This trend is important for several reasons:

- That you are informed
- · If you are behind on your estimate of giving, you have time to catch up before year's end
- If you are looking for somewhere to make a year's end donation for tax purposes, you might be reminded of this option.

But those reasons aside, I believe the most important reason is so that Grace can perform the ministry it is called to do here in Corvallis and through our special offerings the Oregon Synod and the ELCA, throughout the world. In early 2023 (if not before) we will, hopefully, have discovered that "perfect" match of available pastor and our congregation and will be starting a new ministry and further strengthening our ties with the Oregon State Lutheran Campus Ministry. These are exciting times! It would be great to start 2023 with a healthy surplus, as we did when we entered 2022, to cover the hard times but more importantly, to add new ministries and programming.

#### **Christmas in the Grace Library**


