Pastor Dorthy's On Site Working Days Thursday & Sunday

Dear People of God at Grace,

Recently a Lutheran World Relief (LWR) rep was in Oregon to engage with a congregation. Jaime wanted to connect with some pastors to talk about and thank us for supporting the work LWR does, through quilt-making, school kits, and personal kits, as well as financial support. He talked about the challenges that LWR is addressing, along with many other denominational agencies.

Jaime shared with the Vineyard Cluster pastors that the war in Ukraine is having drastic ripple effects all over, from fertilizer shortages in Burkina Faso, to basic grains from Ukraine, and there is a famine developing in Yemen. There are wars and conflicts in Sudan, Myanmar, Columbia, Nigeria, Afghanistan, and Ethiopia as well, which is creating huge humanitarian crises in those places.

Then he shared a story from an LWR worker in Ukraine who was giving out quilts. A young mother received several quilts for her and her two small daughters, asking where these quilts came from. When she heard they had been made with love and prayer, then blessed as they were sent out to LWR to give away, she cried. This mother was touched that people were remembering them in this awful time, and that love was making a difference in her family's survival.

In Psalm 46 it is written "God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble. Therefore we will not fear, thought the earth should change, though the mountains shake...the nations...in an uproar..." Sounds like our times, doesn't it?

Seems like nothing changes...war, turmoil, troubles, are still here. We long for peace and for well-being, for ourselves and for those most in need. We continue to have racial conflicts in the US as well as drug and gang violence. Our world is so broken, it is painful at times to hear the stories.

There are no easy answers to any of these dire conflicts. Lives are at stake. Generations of people are affected.

Yet the story of a mother thankful to be remembered amid war, knowing people are praying and sending hope in quilts and kits means they are not forgotten. Such a small offering has a great impact on the hopelessness of our siblings.

Resources all over the world are available, but supply lines are broken, farming challenged, ac-

cess to clean water and medical support are at critical stress and distress.

The psalmist is certain that "God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble." We believe this, right? In those places, both in the US and throughout the world, a quilt or personal hygiene kit begins to heal and give hope. A reminder that God is at work in those places of turmoil. That we are not enemies, but siblings.

When we see each other as siblings, we can dismantle the walls, the hatred, the fear, and whatever else is keeping us from living peaceably with each other. This is the work of the Lord, the work of our hands, that brings peace one piece at a time. We must not despair but work God's will day by day.

Soon we will be putting together Thanksgiving Baskets to bless our siblings in Corvallis. What can you give to bring peace, healing, hope in these days of trouble? Whatever you can share God will bless and use. And our neighbors will know they are not forgotten in their time of trouble. Those Thanksgiving Baskets will be a sign of God at work, loving them.

Change happens. With it comes trouble as well as opportunity. The opportunity to picture a new horizon of peace and compassion is present. That is what God sees, that is what God is working towards, and that is what God calls us to do.

And when we quiet ourselves in the troubles, we will know that God is God, a present help, working for peace, because of love.

On November 6th we will consecrate our 2023 estimate of giving. I know you are generous and give what you are able. I also know that you give over and above for special needs. On your behalf I have been able to help our siblings with needs that aren't covered by the helping organizations in town. They are so thankful. I tell them that the people of Grace are generous and wanting to help wherever there is need. Hope and healing take hold.

Thank you, dear people of God. These are troubling times, and you give witness to God showing up in so many ways, in your lives and for the sake of our siblings, near and far.


For those persons new to Grace, let me explain just what we do:




