Pastor Dorthy's On Site Working Days Thursday & Sunday

Off Site Working Days Monday - Wednesday & Saturday

Dear God's beloved at Grace.

We are halfway through the season of Epiphany, the truth of Jesus' identity being revealed for all to see. Not only is Jesus revealed as the long, promised One, he does stuff...teaching, preaching, healing, inviting followers.

Crowds of people follow Jesus, hoping, open to listening to his words, bringing the sick to him. They leave their homes, their work, their families to see him, and even follow him.

Essentially the crowds leave their towns to get to Jesus. It's not that he doesn't go into their towns, but that they hear he is near and go out to where he is doing ministry.

If we want to see Jesus at work, if we want to hear him or be healed by him, then we need to go to him, to wear he is being revealed. Where might that be in this part of Oregon? Have your heard or seen him?

Early in January the Corvallis Daytime Drop-In Center (CDDC) needed support letters from the churches. They are applying for grants, including from the State of Oregon, to develop a Navigation Center for our houseless and unemployed neighbors. Currently the CDDC offers breakfast and a sack lunch, along with other essential items, for anyone who comes by M-F 9-noon. If you have been by to drop off food or other things then you have seen the space they are using to serve the needs of people. Jesus is doing great work there.

The Navigation Center the CDDC would like to develop would be a place with offices for other services to be available to anyone needing assistance of almost any kind. A one-stop help center. They need our support.

Vina Moses is wanting to meet with Grace and St Mary's in order to better coordinate services that they provide. Free clothing is available at their center. They also provide gas vouchers, some financial assistance, food and hygiene items, as well as household items. Over 700 kids got backpacks with school supplies in August, and in December they have the Giving Trees with tags for donations suggestions. Jesus is doing a great work there too.

We Care helps with one-time emergency needs. During the pandemic they have had increased

requests for assistance. They need more volunteers to help with things like intake of requests. Jesus is doing great work in this place.

I can go on. Here's the thing...Jesus leaves the building to go out to where the people are. He doesn't wait for them to come to him in one location or another. He goes to where the needs are. He listens to their concerns and requests.

Jesus doesn't sit still. He is on the move and he calls his followers to be on the move with him. Here's a sampling from Matthew's Gospel:

- -"Jesus went throughout out Galilee... (4:23)"
- -"When Jesus entered Capernaum...(8:5)"
- -"As Jesus was walking along, he saw...(9:9)"
- -"As Jesus went on from there...(9:27)"
- -"He left that place and entered their synagogue... (12:9)"
- -"That same day Jesus went out of the house and sat beside the sea...(13:1)"

Over the years the Church has tried all kinds of programs to get people to come in the doors, but that is not how evangelism works. We are the ones who need to leave the building, to go where Jesus is doing ministry and join him.

Epiphany is letting the light of Jesus illumine the way to where people are. People who are looking for hope, for healing, for peace, for justice, for welcome and belonging. Epiphany is all about us helping to shine the light of Jesus into the darkest places of peoples lives to reveal Christ Jesus, to let God's love heal and change us all.

There are a variety of ways we can leave the building, our comfort zones, to go to where Jesus is doing ministry and join in. When Jesus calls his disciples they leave what they were doing to engage with Jesus in ministry. He reveals God's heart over and over. God's love abundantly poured out to all. A love that shines in the darkness to love the whole world.

Where is Jesus calling you to go these days? He is already there...join him...

Some fun historic and romantic reads for February 2023!




