Dear People of God at Grace,

One of the images that St Paul uses for Jesus Christ's Church is that of the human body. This has been such a helpful image and representation of the fullness, diversity, and purpose of the Church.

In the Book called Romans, Paul outlines his theme in 1:16-17: the gospel, the good news, is God's power for salvation for individuals, the Church, and for all of creation. This just God is all about reclaiming the world from the controlling power of sin. Through faith God restores our relationships with God through Christ, and frees us from sin.

In 1 Corinthians 12 Paul asks the questions, is everyone like an eye or a nose? No, the point being we are not alike nor does Jesus call is to be of one mold or type. Instead, there is variety in form, function, and care.

As one part of many of the body of Christ, Grace was gathered in Corvallis, with a multitude of abilities, talents, skills, and gifts. As a body needs all parts to function well, so does Grace need all parts to participate in ministry. This is our worship of God.

For some with energy, there is more active participation. And for those who's energy is not as physical, there is a different type of participation. None are better than another. All are needed.

I think of a woman named Mildred, whom I met years ago. She was in her 90s, and told me her "job" was to be in prayer for the Church, its leaders and pastors. That was so beautiful to hear. This pastor needed to be reminded that the body of Christ needs prayer and pray-ers.

In these days of waiting, anticipating, of planning, hoping, and wondering, we lean on those who are pray-ers to cover us and the rest of creation as others get busy.

We need those who can cheer us on in our work, whether that work be 4-H or Girl Scouts, yard work or leadership. Hope you will visit the barns at the fair in early August and cheer on our youth.

Those who have caught a glimpse of God's

vision, of Grace's new horizon and what that could mean for ministry, need to speak and be heard. Since not all of us are the ears hearing the Spirit's whispers of hope and promise, it is important for the rest of us to listen and discern together what God is up to.

And God is up to things, you know. When I am humbled to use the Ida Fund to support the needs of our neighbors, I am reminded of the relationship of Ida and Vina Moses, and the quiet ministry in which they engaged, because of the Spirit's whispering in their ears, and what their eyes saw in the community. Those two women, and other people too, I am sure, sprinted into action because the gospel, the good news, had worked on their hearts. This was their worship of God.

In recent months we have heard the voice of God speak through young people who have also been impacted by the gospel's power...the powerful love of a just God who longs for us to care for each other, especially those who have been excluded, harmed, are suffering, and in need of compassion that is holy and just.

The passage from Romans 12 encourages us to live out the gospel each day...

"I appeal to you therefore, brothers and sisters, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God, which is your spiritual worship.

Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your minds, so that you may discern what is the will of God—what is good and acceptable and perfect."

May God continue to renew each one of us for the days ahead. And may be discern and be renewed in body, mind and spirit into the likeness of the One who created all things. Peace.

Mt. Angel PNACL Conference 2023 By Jody Parker

This summer's Pacific Northwest Association of Church Libraries (PNACL) Conference was at Mt. Angel Abbey in Mt. Angel, Oregon, June 23 and 24. It kicked off with a tour of the Library, designed by Finnish architect Alvo Aalto, built in 1968 and dedicated in 1970 with a celebration when Duke Ellington performed. Brother Albert showed us several "Book of Hours" copied by monks from the 1100's to 1500's. A Pre-Lutheran Bible was valued at a million dollars. Before the workshops, I walked the iconic path of the Stations of the Cross. Workshops I attended were: 1) Banned Books, by Elaine Peterson member and former Professor. This is not a new phenomenon, but 40% more books were challenged in 2020 than in 2022. Among the official "7 Banned Books Christians Should Read" list, are: To Kill a Mocking Bird; Harry Potter Series; I Know Why the Caged Bird Sings; Diary of Anne Frank; and The Bible; 2) Christian Fiction, where the audience contributed titles for reading; 3) Book Discussion of: The Extraordinary Deaths of Mrs. Kip, where Mrs. Kip is on Hospice. A young reporter is surreptitiously sent to interview her about Kip's leading the relocation of Laotian people during the early 70's, based on true incidents. We were also instructed on how to lead an interview in constructing someone's autobiography.

The keynote speaker was Pastor Jason Hague, from Junction City, who spoke on parenting his autistic son.

His speech was touching and inspirational to the group. During the Conference, each time the monks were to gather for their group prayers throughout the day, the Abbey tower bells clamored for 5 minutes. Twice a day they rang all the bells, one being over 4 tons, is if it were the triumphant end of WWII. Friday evening, I read
