





Beloved Siblings in Christ,

It is my delight and honor to be your new pastor! Thank you to everyone who has already made me feel so welcome. I can't wait to journey with you in faith. January we will be having several Rendezvous with Remy events! These events will allow me to meet more of you in smaller groups. You can get to know me and I can get to know you. We tried to create a variety of events, so that there are a variety of ways to engage. God created a beautifully diverse creation and having a diverse set of events is one way to honor God and each other. That being said fellowship events are an amazing way for all of us to get to know each other. If you can't make the ones in January, do not fret I have a feeling these will not be the only events of this kind. Dinners, walks, game nights, are wonderful ways of being in community with one another.

I have been so blessed by you this past month. Thank you for the wisdom and grace you have shown me. As the months go by I would love to learn more about the rituals that are meaningful to you. When you think back to your time at Grace (or even other churches), what rituals, hymns, bible studies, or small groups made you feel deeply connected to our Creator? What moments inspired a breakthrough in your own spiritual life? One of my favorite parts of the liturgy happens almost every service is the Confession and Forgiveness. Here is where we confess our sins as a community and as a community receive grace and forgiveness. There are times every week in which my actions harm my neighbor. Where I make judgements on my neighbor, don't help others where I had the capacity to, and I know I participate in larger systems where I don't know the ramifications. Was this product that I bought made ethically? Did they pay their workers a living wage? Can I even afford a different product? We don't always know all the consequences to our actions when we are called to love our neighbor.

How then should I keep track of these things? Should I just stop trying to be good and ethical if there is no point? Breathe. God doesn't keep a tally sheet of all the good and bad you do waiting to smite you if you have one more tally in the bad column. Life is more grey, and God loves and cherishes you. God gives you his grace which frees you to better love your neighbor.

Yes, we should try to limit our harm to one another, and try to put more good in the word. God gives us grace. This is not a net sum game. In the Confession and Forgiveness part of the liturgy we confess all the ways knowingly and unknowingly we have failed. And we ask for God's grace. God tells us there is nothing you could do to lose my grace or my love. You are always my child and I want good things for you.

Before each service I like to remind my assistants that don't worry if you mess up, say the wrong word, or do something out of order – grace abounds. God will show up even if we say the words wrong, even if there is unresolved conflict, even if I trip and fall on my face up the aisle. Because of God's grace for us, we are more graceful with each other and ourselves. After we confess our sins the person who is leading the service forgives us our sins, so that we can better live in community with each other.

Pronouns! We all use pronouns every day. Gender is how we relate to ourselves and each other. Gender is a way that many people have related to each other. If you have ever attended a women's or men's group and felt like the environment allowed you to be more vulnerable because of the gender around you, you've experienced how gender is important. Language is imperfect and something that we have constantly changed to better reflect the truth that we feel. The pronouns you should use to refer to me are they/them/theirs. This best reflects my gender. This will be a learning curve, and we will have grace with one another. If you get it wrong, I will try to say "ouch". Then you are given the opportunity to try the sentence again with the correct pronoun. It's going to take some time, and we will show each other grace as we learn.



Courtyard Memorial Project

The Courtyard is a special architectural feature of our church. With tender loving care, the shrubbery and flowers and the tree are maintained to make this an inviting space. It is a space for social gathering. It is a quiet space for personal reflection. It is a space for worship such as Lenten service campfire prior to Easter Sunday.

The Courtyard will be renovated with a new walking surface to fix the concrete deck that is cracked and uneven causing a safety problem. The Property Committee envisions the new walking surface to be 12-inch square pavers that are rose and grey colored and installed in a checkerboard pattern. The rose colored pavers will be the memorial pavers that can be inscribed with the individual's name and date.

The Property Committee is requesting special contributions from individual members and former Grace members to fund this renovation project with the pavers. The project cost is estimated to be \$21,000; the Grace Foundation has graciously agreed to fund \$14,000 as matching funds (2:1 ratio) for the \$7,000 to be contributed from individual members. Checks payable to Grace Lutheran Church to the escrow account "Courtyard Memorial Project" will ensure that your contribution is recorded as a charitable contribution.



Book Suggestion: Gospel Parallels

From Jody Parker

The Grace Church Library has a book of Gospel Parallels A Synopsis of the First Three Gospels of the Revised Standard Version. Good Reads has this to say about a later edition of the Grace Church Library copy: "A classic since 1949, Gospel Parallels presents Matthew, Mark and Luke printed side-by-side for easy and enlightening study. Using a parallel arrangement of columns, Gospel Parallels, highlights differences and similarities in language and chronology between the first three gospels. This unique reference tool will benefit anyone interested in examining the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus. Preachers will find this work useful for creating a complete picture of the life of Christ. Students of the English Bible will use it to come to their own conclusions about the variations in Matthew. Mark. and Luke. Advanced scholars will use the scholarly apparatus to study the textual variations in the earliest known Greek and Latin Manuscripts."

I have found it interesting to look and compare the gospels for a quick reference study. It is easier and less cumbersome than going thru the New Testament Bible itself and trying to locate the passages. If you are curious and would like to enhance your study of Jesus and the New Testament and would like to develop study skills, then this handy book is one you will enjoy to read and peruse. It's also handy to have and practical if you are doing a Bible Study group.
