Let us March On! Thank you to everyone who made my installation a special day. I am now "Official"! I am so glad that my parents were able to come up and spend time here as I get to know the area. One of the days we drove to the coast to Yaquina head lighthouse. The clouds were overhead with the sun occasionally peeking out. Low tide was starting and we were the first there to explore. With the field guide in hand from the local park rangers we carefully stepped out on this cobble stone beach in search of nudibranchs in the tide pools. We saw fish and coral and even a crab before finally seeing a bright yellow nudibranch. Nudibranchs are sea slugs that come in a variety of colors that I have found fascinating. Some can even gain the abilities of the things they eat (look up leaf sheep)! Nudibranchs bring me such joy because they are such eclectic cute creatures. Seeing them feels like such a chance encounter that makes me so in the moment. This has been such a busy time as I adjust to what it means to live on this side of the mountains. Creation grounds me. It is not hard to just be in awe of creation. In fact, the hardest thing about searching the tide pools was not breaking my ankle again. The days are getting longer and we are starting to go more outside and be in God's creation. What are your nudibranchs? What are little things you search for that give you joy? Let's share this joy with one another.



Memorial Courtyard Pavers



The goal of the pavers installed in the Courtyard is to provide a place to memorialize members of Grace Church. It will provide a place for remembrance and contemplation. Only deceased members, their spouse, close family members or "Friends of Grace" who have moved away may be memorialized in the Courtyard. People wishing to memorialize someone in the Courtyard should contact the Property Committee and select the location for their paver.

The Property Committee will maintain a master log for all the paver locations reserved. They

will assist you in how to purchase the blank paver from Willamette Graystone and how to have it engraved at R3 Engraving. Carol Warloe will personally guide you in this process, the letter style, the font size, and what can be engraved. The average cost for an engraved paver is about \$60 each.

The paver shall be returned to the Property Committee for placement that will be done about twice per year. The cleaning maintenance will also be done each year by the Property Committee.



Stone Soup of Corvallis Needs Volunteers

Grace has seized the opportunity to prepare dinner for Stone Soup at First Christian Church on the 3rd Sunday of every month. Four to Five volunteers are needed to help. Volunteers would arrive at First Christian at 1:30 pm to prepare the meal which is served at 5:30 pm. A separate group of volunteers, not from Grace, do the setup, prepare the drinks, serve the food and do clean-up. So when we are finished preparing dinner, we can choose to leave or to stay and help the other volunteers.

Keith, the kitchen manager will provide the menu for the meal and work with us couple of times to help us get used to the kitchen. All the food will be on-site and be ready for us to prepare. All volunteers will need to view a couple of videos, read a couple of documents (e-mailed to you from me) and take the short on-line test to get a Food Handler's card, prior to volunteering. The Food Handler's card cost is \$9.00 and if desired, would be reimbursed by Stone Soup.

I am currently looking for volunteers for April and beyond (April 21, May 19, June 16, etc). If you or someone you know is interested in volunteering please contact Frank Davis. I will compile a list of those interested and send an email every month with the dates Grace is scheduled. Then, you can email back the dates you can volunteer.

Barclay Commentary Books By Jody Parker

The Gospel of Matthew from The Daily Study Bible Series by William Barclay, printed by the Westminster Press, is an excellent way to explore the Gospel of the New Testament. This series of books, as they are done also on the Gospels of Mark, Luke and John as well, is available in the Grace Church Library. This type of commentary reading has the aim "to convey the results of scholarship to the ordinary reader." The book's style is designed for the reader to follow along with the biblical text, which is then followed by 3 or 4 pages of commentary by Dr. William Barclay.

Here is an example which Barclay discusses on The Lord's Prayer. Consider on page 224 this verse, Matthew 6:13: "And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from the Evil One." Barclay explores this verse by saying, "There are two matters of meaning at which we must look before we begin to study this petition in detail. (i) To modern ears the word tempt is always a bad word; it always means to seek to seduce into evil. But in the Bible the verb peirazein is often better translated by the word test than by the word tempt. In its New Testament usage to tempt a person is not so much to seek to seduce him into sin, as it is to test his strength and his loyalty and his ability for service." I don't know about you, but this illuminating insight is refreshing and quite a relief to hear! It is such an enlightening statement that an avid Bible student wants to know more.

Peppered throughout his commentaries are accounts and quotes from well-known authors and ideas from other sources that delight and enlighten his writings, such as Robert Louis Stevenson and Tennyson, to name only two. The Daily Study Bible Series are a wonderful addition to have on hand while reading on one's own, or participating in a formal Bible Study.

Grace Library not only has the Gospels in the series, but also volumes of the Daily Study Bible on the epistles of the New Testament. On February 21st, Grace began a Lenten Bible Study on 1 Corinthians and Grace Library has an edition of that epistle in the Daily Study Bible Series with which you may want to supplement your reading and understanding of that book of the Bible.


