Beloved Siblings in Christ,

I wanted to give everyone an update on the Ida fund. Your bottle drop bags that you pick up in the narthex fund this account in the church. The Ida fund is what we use for emergency assistance. Other congregations have called this the pastor's discretionary account. When I got here, this was used to buy \$15 Fred Meyer's gift card to be used for gas. \$15 doesn't cover a full tank of gas and we didn't know if they were being used for gas at all. There were limits placed on how many times people could receive these cards in a year. Several people came back to get these cards the maximum amount that we would allow, and when the new year rolled around we would see the same people again. We found that these people in need were not getting enough to get them out of the situation they were in, and they had cobbled together the resources they could find to coast. This left them unable to spend the mental energy necessary to figure out a new financial situation.

Now, I am not a trained social worker. I am starting to learn where resources are available in this city. Grace works with several different organizations to help serve the people of Corvallis. For Instance, Grace was already a part of this interagency assistance network with Vina Moses, We Care, St Mary, St Vincent's, and more. Vina Moses and We Care do an intake process with these people that are in an impossible financial situation, and they guide these people into better financial situations. They could be facing a bad medical bill. The lce storm in January affected many families prohibiting work, or causing unexpected bills. Most of the families and individuals helped need assistance this time and then they are able to bounce back. The bill will be split up through the interagency assistance network which means more individuals and families will be served and stay in their housing situation. Once a person is unhoused it costs way more money to get them stable housing. The Ida fund is a wonderful thing and I am so glad it exists, but it can only help so much. I decided based on these conversations with everyone involved that shifting our focus to these interagency assistance requests was a more sustainable way to use our Ida fund. This helps people back on their feet and stewards the resources that we have. The people we help are connected to people with training to help them navigate these different systems so that they can reach some financial stability.

This year we have helped 26 individuals or families either stay in their current housing or helped them move to a place they could better afford. 26 households that don't have to worry about losing their housing because of this congregation's generosity. There are many ways to give and I am so thankful of the role we get to play. Your cans and bottles add up. So as you relax in God's creation and drink a celebratory beverage, save the can, so we can keep serving others.






